



POST-PROCEDURE HOME CARE INSTRUCTIONS

****READ CAREFULLY****

Touch Up Session which is part of the treatment cost excluding freckles, beauty mark and SMP. **First Touch-Up Session** must be completed within 6 weeks of the Initial treatment (we recommend that you schedule your Touch Up Session before you leave the salon).

If you need to cancel or reschedule an appointment, please let us know 48 hours before your scheduled appointment. No-shows or cancellations within 48 hours of scheduled appointment will be charged additional \$50.00 on top of \$40.00 deposit. First Touch-Up Session we charge the equivalent of a 6-month Touch-Up \$100 to reschedule the appointment

IMPORTANT

1. Some redness, swelling, light bruising and slight itching during the healing process post procedure are normal.
2. If you experience heavy itching, extreme swelling, blistering, or any other complications within the first 24 hours after your procedure, stop using your after-care product immediately. If symptoms continue, or you experience abnormal swelling or redness or tenderness of the procedure site, red streaks going from the procedure site towards the heart, elevated body temperature, purulent drainage (thick, opaque drainage that is tan, yellow, green or brown) from the procedure site or other symptoms or signs of infection, or breathing difficulties, go to your closest hospital emergency department immediately.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

1. Most procedures are a two-step process, and final results cannot be determined until this touch-up application is completed. This touch-up is intended to fill in any discoloration caused by the healing and shedding process. It is strongly recommended to all clients that they make an appointment for this touch-up even if they feel they do not need it.
2. Do not wash the procedure area for 24 hours. After this initial period, use very mild soap and warm water for washing - gently dab, and do not rub – until fully healed. Re-apply Vaseline only as needed.
3. Do not apply makeup or makeup remover on the procedure area until fully healed.
4. Do not touch the procedure area with your fingers until fully healed; they may have bacteria on them and cause an infection.
5. Use a clean cotton swab to apply A&D Ointment or Vaseline only as needed for seven (7) to ten (10) days. If you are allergic to A&D Ointment and Vaseline, call your physician for an alternative product.
6. Do not rub or traumatize the procedure area while it is healing; this may remove pigment along with crusting tissue.
7. For seven (7) to ten (10) days, avoid contact with animals, bathing, gardening, saunas, jacuzzis, steam rooms, swimming pools, oceans, lakes, streams and rivers until the procedure area is fully healed.
8. If exposure to the sun cannot be avoided, use a “total sun block” sunscreen on the procedure area to help prevent future fading of pigment color.
9. Use of products that contain alpha hydroxyl acids (AHAs) may prematurely fade pigment color; try to stay away from these products. Examples of AHAs include glycolic and lactic acids; always check your product labeling.
10. Use ice on the procedure area – wrapped in CLEAN plastic wrap or other clean container – to prevent bruising or swelling.
